The TVWC has been doing Community Service Projects for years. In 2012, our Club received a Community Service Award from the Tellico Village Property Owners Association, in part, for its community service project work. From 2008 to 2012, our Club helped many individuals and over 50 different clubs and organizations. Our service to individuals has frequently involved the construction of wheelchair ramps, an example of which is shown below.

This year, we have taken on 23 community service projects and have completed 16 of them. We are still working on 2 large DVD racks for the Library, alteration of a

communion table for the Community Church, construction of a 16' wheelchair ramp for a Tellico Village resident, and construction of 4 large work tables for the Good Neighbor Shoppe.
