A very successful Toys for Tots is over for another year. Thanks to everyone who stepped up and participated. With all the new members, hopefully we can have more participation next year. It is not too soon to think about leading a team and getting the new people involved.

We had about the same number of Woodworkers and toys built as last year. There were 14 teams with 62 members. There were 12 individuals. Together they

made around 370 toys. In addition, we received well over 450 toys from the Tellico Villagers. Marcia Kowalski made her annual donation of 50 dolls and 50 stuffed animals. We provided the sheriff's department with an amazing 1000 plus toys to distribute to needy children. Debbie Hines said that they had over 400 kids signed up.

Also amazing was the amount of cash that was collected. From the members community service project donations, we got \$2,000. A big chunk of that was the donation of \$1,000 that we received for helping to rebuild the booths at the community playhouse. \$1,270 was in direct donations mailed to the sheriff. The Tarpons swim club collected \$1,650 that was donated to the sheriff through the Woodworkers Club at their annual banquet. My calculator comes up with \$4,920!!

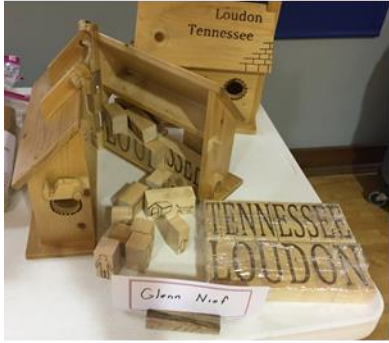
The presentation was well attended and well received. Present were Sheriff Guider, Debbie Hines and Representative Lowell Russell who made a brief appearance.

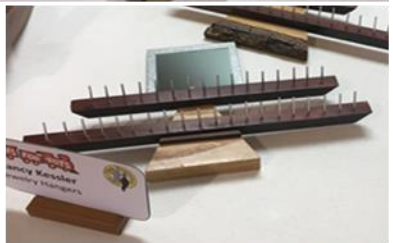

Tellico Village Woodworkers Toys-For-Tots 2019







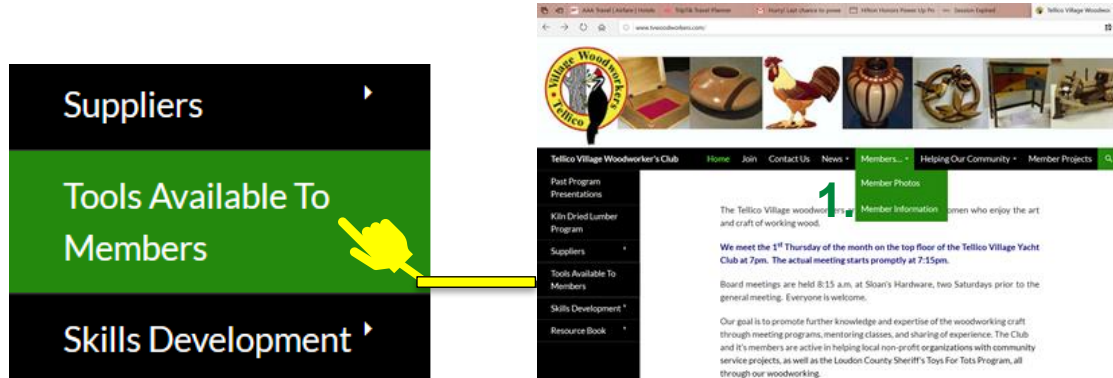

TOOLS AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS



As a member benefit, many tools available for your use. There are three types of tools:

- Large stationary shop tools owned by the club, located in club member shops. These “Keeper”, club members, are responsible for maintaining the tool and making it available to you, free of charge.
- The club also owns a number of loaner portable tools that can be used in a member’s own shop, also free of charge.
- Lastly, many club members have made their personal tools available to other members. Most of these can be borrowed from the owner and used in your own shop. Other are large stationary tools that must be used in the owner’s shop.

To use any of these tools, simply call the owner (or keeper) and make arrangements to use it. Please make sure that if you borrow portable tools, you use them promptly and return it the owner in a timely manner.

A **searchable** list of tools that are available to all club members. To find the tool you would like to borrow or use, **type the tool in the search box**. The table will be automatically sorted, returning items that match the search term. To use or borrow the tool, contact the member or keeper of the tool.
