Did You Know?

Last year, a group of researchers announced they had developed wood that they say is 23 times harder than its natural counterpart. They used the hardened wood to make a table knife that their study shows is nearly three times sharper than commercial table knives, like those made from steel, plastic and natural wood.


To create the hardened wood, researchers used a process involving a chemical treatment, water rinsing, and both cold and hot presses on basswood. They then soaked it in food-grade mineral oil to increase its water resistance and carved the material into knives. Reportedly, these knives work great on cutting steak and other firm foods but cutting very thin slices of smoked salmon may be a struggle.

Miraculous Stairway

If you ever get to Santa Fe, you should make a point to visit the Lorretta Chapel. Inside you will get to see the miraculous spiral staircase.



Built in 1878, the staircase rises 20 feet to connecting to the choir loft while making two complete revolutions with 33 steps without the support of a newel or central post. Only wooden pegs and glue were used in its construction.



Besides Bruce, Aaron Cox, Dave Fagerlin, Tom Borloglou and Carl Hagen assisted with the construction and moving the completed project to its new home. About 130 manhours was invested in the project.



Apart from claims of its miraculous nature, it is a remarkable feat of woodworking. It would be difficult today, much less 140 years ago with only crude hand tools, no electricity and minimal resources.
